II. Awards

1. New Currents Award

[Winner 1] The Wrestler | Iqbal H. CHOWDHURY | Bangladesh / Canada

Jury Comment: It was moving to witness the vision, aesthetic aspirations, and profound interest and passion for social issues through the eyes of 10 new directors in this year's selections from the New Currents section. Deciding on 2 awardees was a true challenge, as every film was exceptional. One of the winners is *The Wrestler* by Iqbal H. Chowdhury. 2. KIM Jiseok Award

[Winner 1] Paradise | Prasanna VITHANAGE | Sri Lanka / India

Jury Comment: One award goes to *Paradise*, directed by Prasanna Vithanage. Through this film, Prasanna Vithanage exposes how a corrupt regime ruins this beautiful country by obstructing peace, depriving its citizens of humanity as they corner them into oppression. It is a film that carries the curiosity that sparked from a small, everyday moment, eventually leading to an ironic ending.

[Winner 2] Bride Kidnapping | Mirlan ABDYKALYKOV | Kyrgyzstan

Jury Comment: Another recipient is *Bride Kidnapping,* directed by Mirlan Abdykalykov. This film vividly depicts the prevalent shocking customs in Kyrgyzstan with unforgettable characters and a straightforward narrative. It is a powerful film that evokes fulfilling excitement as it enters our lives.

3. BIFF Mecenat Award

[Winner 1] The Voices of the Silenced | PARK Soo-nam, PARK Maeui | Korea / Japan

Jury Comment: In addition to various unresolved issues from before the war between South Korea and Japan to the present, such as the comfort women issue and forced recruitment, the director's "sight" includes the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki and the Battle of Okinawa, where the Pacific War unfolded. For over 50 years, she has fought against oblivion with her camera. Park Soo-nam, a Zainichi director, now wants to digitize her films to preserve them and the stories of the Korean laborers under coercion and Comfort Women in Japan for the next generation, together with her daughter. It is moving to see how a mother and daughter's vision can connect as they work together, and their conversations become another voice that needs to be heard as repressed history is brought to life.

[Winner 2] Republic | JIN Jiang | Singapore / China

Jury Comment: Eryang's dreams and utopias know no bounds. In his eight-square-meter room, the musician proclaims his republic and turns it into a liberated area. "Republic" is always crowded with people. There is conversation, drinking, and singing. Sex, drugs, and rock'n'roll meet Xi Jinping and Mao Zedong, and American pop music meets criticism of capitalism. This work highlights the freedom with which today's young people put into practice the image of Republic effortlessly in a small space. What is more interesting is that the creator used a unique and adventurous method to depict the work without stepping outside this extremely narrow space. This film takes us into the attitude towards the life of a youth who has no money to survive the day.

4. Sonje Award

[Winner 1] MYDEAR | JEON Dohee, KIM Sohee | Korea

Jury Comment: We unanimously selected *MYDEAR* as the winner, which boldly attempted to blend melodrama and science fiction. The work demonstrates remarkable finesse while portraying sensitivity towards minorities. This film successfully weaves stories from various layers into a single theme, rooted in a profound understanding and sympathy toward individuals with disabilities. We want to highlight the delicate and focused performance of the director and actor Jeon Dohee, who portrayed the protagonist with a hearing impairment. Her compelling performance moved the hearts of the audience deeply. We eagerly anticipate the future works of directors Kim Sohee and Jeon Dohee.

[Winner 2] 21 Weeks Later | Nasrin MOHAMMADPOUR | Iran

Jury Comment: Our jury deeply empathized with *21 Weeks Later* for addressing the reality and suffering of Iranian women who lack autonomy over their bodies. This is not just an issue in Iran but one that many women continue to face worldwide, reminding us that it remains a pertinent question. The decision to terminate a pregnancy is a small liberation over one's body, but the reality of being a woman tragically presents more significant barriers. *21 Weeks Later* succinctly portrays such a theme in a non-conventional cinematic language. The film questions what motherhood truly means and how to combat the despairing reality, making it all the more noteworthy.

[Special Mention] Everybody's Gotta Love Sometimes | Sein LYAN TUN | France / Myanmar / Indonesia

Jury Comment: We would like to specifically mention *Everybody's Gotta Love Sometimes* by Sein Lyan Tun, a director from Myanmar. It eloquently transforms personal wounds and traumas into the language of cinema. The protagonist, Phyo, is a queer Asian immigrant residing in Paris, who is concurrently a victim of sexual violence. The traumas of his past is teased through sporadic sounds akin to hallucinations, while his current focus lies in the language of liberated gestures. Rather than exhaustively explaining every detail, the film successfully employs powerful, evocative music coupled with moderate storytelling. We



express our profound support for Phyo's journey towards genuine mental and physical freedom, extending deep admiration and encouragement for the work of director Sein Lyan Tun.

14. KBS Independent Film Award

[Winner] House of the Seasons | OH Jung-min | Korea

Jury Comment: The juries of the KBS Independent Film Award—Director Kim Chohee, Producer Lee Jinsook, and Film Critic Ju Sungchul—unanimously decided to award director Oh Jung-min's *House of the Seasons*. Invited to the 'Korean Cinema Today - Vision', *House of the Seasons* delicately explores the intimate relationships within a three-generational family, portraying them with both dryness and occasional intensity. While numerous works, such as Im Kwon-Taek's *Festival* (1996) and Park Chul-soo's *Farewell My Darling* (1996), satirically depict the intertwining of funerals and extended families, House of the Seasons expansively broadens the landscape of family stories in our society, whether one likes to accept the changes or not. The narrative and imagery undoubtedly make this film a standout discovery of the year.

The professional performances of the child actors, including Park Na-eun in the role of Dong-chun, are also awe-inspiring.

Jury Comment: The film delicately captures discrimination and discomfort experienced by the protagonist with a hearing impairment in her everyday life. It exhibits a high level of cinematic craftsmanship, with a warming atmosphere surrounding the film and actor's natural performance.

[Winner 2] KARMA | CHOI Soohyuk | Korea

Jury Comment: The film's unique cinematography, music, and art style, reminiscent of classic movies, make this film captivating. The witty expression and skillful direction maintaining a dramatic tension throughout, were outstanding. We look forward to the director's subsequent work.

Jury Comment: *The Berefts* presents meticulously crafted direction through impressive characters and cinematographic techniques. The ambiguity in the narrative intensifies the tension of the work and foreshadows the characters' destinies. This film, providing the audience with lasting resonance, showcases peculiar characters and the ways in which they are expressed to align seamlessly.

III. Final Report

1. Successful Event Focusing on the Essence of the Film Festival

Despite concerns due to reduced budget, the Busan International Film Festival could host a successful event without fail, building on its strong foundation of 27 years. It was a year that once again concentrated on the essence of film festivals, of watching good films together and meeting to share each other's thoughts and opinions through conversation.

2. Prominent Figures of Cinema at the Film Festival

Following the host Song Kang Ho, who kicked off the 28th Busan International Film Festival, Han Yeri and Jung Woo, the juries for the Actor of the Year Award, jointly marked the grand finale. Including figures like Chow Yun Fat, Luc Besson, Fan Bingbing, Kore-eda Hirokazu and Hamaguchi Ryusuke, numerous international and Korean filmmakers engaged in interactions with the audience through events such as GV, Open Talks, and Outdoor Greetings.

3. Film Festival Packed with Audiences, Increased Occupied Seats!

The number of selected works decreased compared to last year, but the seat occupancy rate, which was 74% last year, increased to 82% this year, reaffirming ongoing interest from the audience. A total of 142,432 audiences participated in various events including 252 GVs, and 294 screenings were sold out of the 209 officially selected works.



4. Special Program in Focus: Korean Diasporic Cinema, Renaissance of Indonesian Cinema

The Korean American Special Program in Focus: Korean Diasporic Cinema, which for the first time, gathered Korean American directors and actors who are active in Hollywood, received great praise from the audience – so much that many voiced it should be an annual program. As for the Renaissance of Indonesian Cinema, 12 feature-length and short films along with 150 filmmakers and actors attended the festival and market events, highlighting the achievements of Indonesia and the prominence of Asian cinema today.

5. Diverse Outdoor Events and Actors' House Received High Praise

From 12 Open Talks with the opening film, *Because I Hate Korea*, CHOW Yun Fat: True Colors of a Hero 周潤發之英雄風範, and more, and 11 Outdoor Greetings including *KYRIE*, Shining Stars from Indonesia, *Cobweb*, and 3 sessions of Master Class and Special Talk, the outdoor events garnered much attention from the audience. Furthermore, Actors' House, which was hosted by Youn Yuh-jung, Han Hyo-joo, Song Joong-ki, and John Cho, allowed the audience to see the genuine reactions of the actors, as they were pleasantly surprised to see a full house each time.

6. p!tt and p!tt GROUND, Attempt for an Enhanced Festival Experience for the Audience

"p!tt" was first launched in 2022 with the aim of showcasing not only official selections but also various cultural events at BIFF. Now in its second year, p!tt has created a space called p!tt GROUND, an audience lounge combined with a merchandise shop. It presented special merchandise integrated with the festival's programs and collaborated with various brands, resulting in numerous sold-out cases. In particular, collaborative products with CGV CINESHOP and local brands in Busan gained much attention throughout the festival period,



reflecting the festival's commitment to symbiotic relationships between the film industry and the local community.

7. Record-High Participation in the Asian Contents & Film Market

Marking its 18th edition, the Asian Contents & Film Market saw an increase with participants from 49 countries, totaling 2,479 attendees, and filled a 30% larger exhibition space with 98 booths offering diverse industry programs, compared to the previous year. Participants were actively engaged in business meetings and networking opportunities. The Asian Project Market, focusing on film co-production and investment, along with the Busan Story Market, dedicated to IP content sales, hosted a total of 1,826 meetings. The ACFM Conference, comprising of 30 sessions including pitching, forums, and seminars, explored the current and future aspects of the content industry. Notably, at this year's inaugural Rising Films International Awards, director Kim Mijo won for *The Journey To Gyeongju*, securing support for a maximum production budget of 1 billion won.

8. Asia Contents Awards & Global OTT Awards Expanded to the Global Stage

The Asia Contents Awards & Global OTT Awards, co-hosted by the Ministry of Science and ICT and Busan Metropolitan City this year, marked the beginning of an even more progressive content awards ceremony by expanding the scope of content globally. Compared to the previous year, 5 additional award categories were introduced, totaling 17 sections. Disney Plus' *Moving* received awards in various categories, including Best Creative, Best Writer, Best Lead Actor, and Best Newcomer Actor. Netflix's *Scoop* also garnered attention by winning the Best Asian TV Series and Best Lead Actress awards.

9. Community BIFF Led by the Audience, and BIFF Everywhere Welcoming a New Era with Expanded Collaborations



Community BIFF achieved a nearly 80% seat occupancy rate this year, thanks to the program's qualitative improvement and diversification. Request Cinema had a record number of requests, and the lineup of prominent guests including Kim Jee-woon, Bong Joon Ho, Lim Soo-jung, Chung Seokyung, and Jung Hoon Hee, along with collaborations with domestic organizations, sparked discussions. BIFF Everywhere, in its effort to showcase the unique charm of Busan, provided unforgettable memories to the audience in distinctive locations such as Dongnaehyanggyo, Gimhae International Airport, and the Busan Eurasia Platform. It successfully attempted to approach the citizens, away from the Busan Cinema Center and reveal the true essence of the festival. Introducing a BIFF Everywhere in Yeouido highlighted a fresh development extending beyond Busan to major cities nationwide.

V. Asian Contents & Film Market (ACFM) Summary

A total of 2,479 people from 49 countries participated in the 2023 Asian Contents & Film Market. This marks a record-breaking participation rate, having increased by 223 registrants compared to last year - excluding press and festival invitees who were registered to access online screenings, and only including business-associated participants. Increased by 30% since the previous year, the exhibition hall was filled with 271 institutions and companies from 23 countries, actively promoting and selling diverse contents. Notably, the Asian Project Market selected 30 narrative feature film projects from 13 countries, which led to a record-breaking 826 meetings, which has increased by 17% since last year.

As for the Busan Story Market, 50 Original IPs from Korea and Asia held 1,000 meetings, leading to business feats such as Toyou's Dream, one of the IP agencies that participated as an individual booth, signing a webtoon and audiovisual co-production agreement with a global content production studio, Whynot Media.

Additionally, about 20 market conferences, 11 programs from Platform BUSAN, and the new PB Lounge provided opportunities for networking and exchange of information specialized from each industry, and strengthened its function as a business platform for not only Korea, but all of Asia's film and audiovisual production and sales.
